



Police Officer Alvin D. Stonehouse



P.O. Alvin D. Stonehouse was born in 1943 and raised in nearby Midland Park. He enlisted in the New Jersey Army National Guard 50th Armored Division in 1963 where he served as a Military Police Officer until his honorable discharge in 1969 as a Sergeant. He was appointed to the Glen Rock Police Department on April 13, 1970 and completed basic training at the Bergen County Police Academy on June 5, 1970. In April of 1975 he was certified as a Narcotics Investigator.

In 1973 he received a Meritorious Service award for his actions resulting in the arrest of four men fleeing the scene of an armed home invasion which occurred at a Gramercy Place residence on November 30th, 1973. He, along with Officers Jay Green and George Miller captured all four robbers following a short pursuit.

P.O. Stonehouse served the Glen Rock Police Department with honor and distinction until his disability retirement on June 1, 1979. He was a Silver Life member of Glen Rock PBA Local #110 and a member of the Glen Rock Police Pistol Team. In the years following his retirement he relocated to Pennsylvania where he resided until his passing on October 20th, 2014.
