



## Sergeant Jay Green



Sgt. Jay Green was a highly decorated veteran of the GRPD who served with honor and distinction for twenty-five years. A veteran of the United States Marine Corps who briefly served with the New York State Police, Sgt. Green joined the GRPD April 20<sup>th</sup> 1964. He was promoted to Sergeant on August 14<sup>th</sup>, 1978 and retired on December 1<sup>st</sup> 1989.

Among his many commendations, Sgt. Green received a meritorious service commendation for his actions on September 9, 1974 following an attempted murder on Harristown Road. He, along with officers Frank Kozar and Robert Brindley pursued and apprehended an armed subject who had fired five shots from a .38 caliber revolver before leaving the victim shot and wandering for help in the street.

In the 1970's he and Det. Lon Hotchkiss received the combat cross and medal of valor after confronting and exchanging gunfire with an armed robbery suspect while assisting the Fair Lawn Police Department in responding to a hold up at a bar on Maple Avenue.

He was a Silver Life Member of Glen Rock PBA Local # 110 and a member of the Glen Rock Police Pistol Team. Sgt. Green is survived by his wife Jacqueline (nee Darr) and his children Tracey and Brett.
